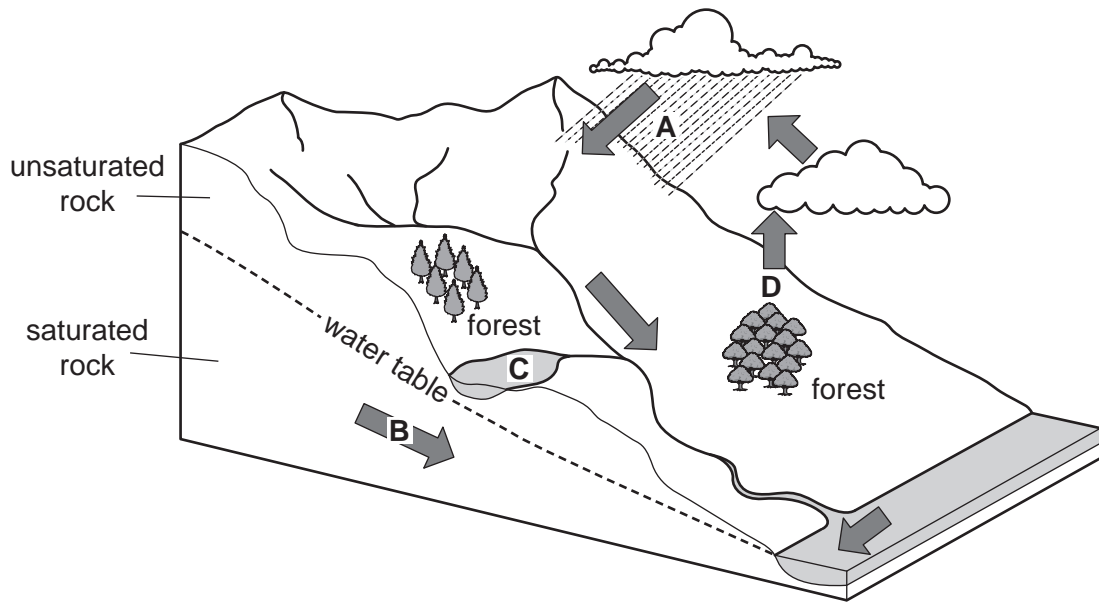

Types of mass movement

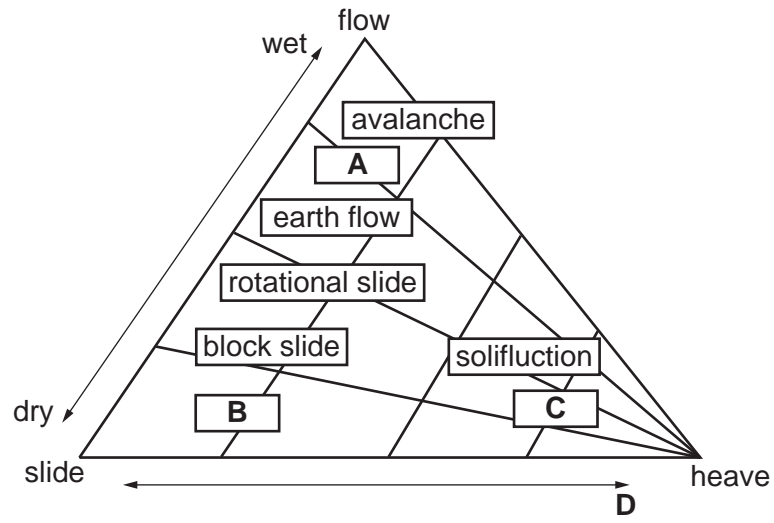

A simplified age/sex pyramid for an MEDC, 2013

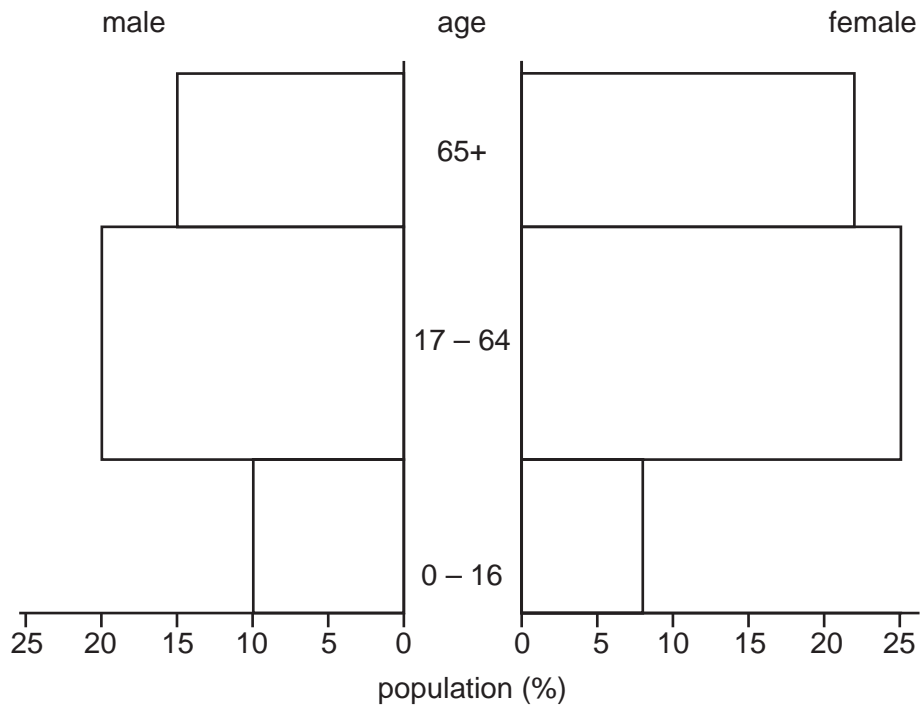
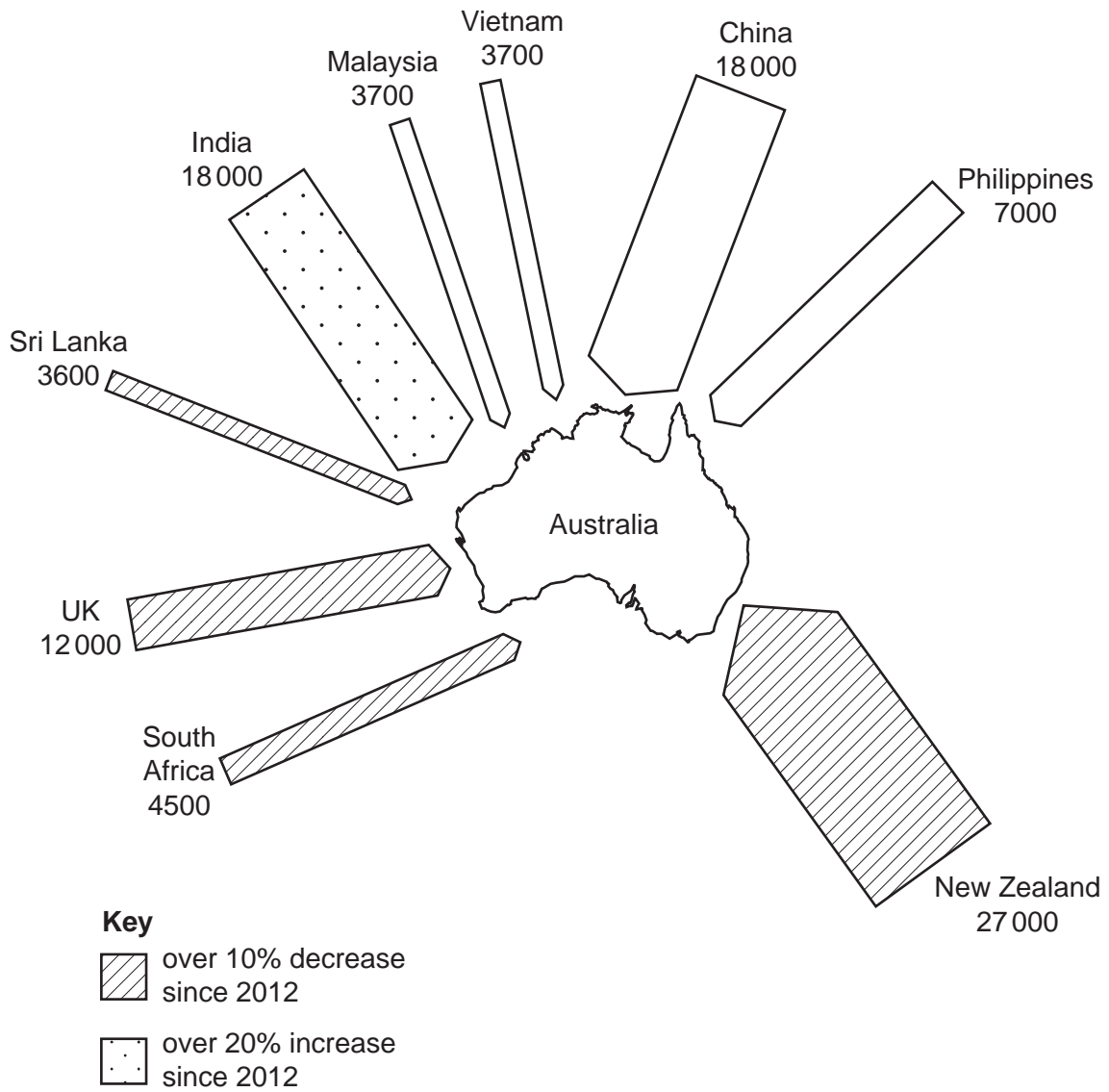

The main origins of international migrants into Australia, an MEDC, 2013

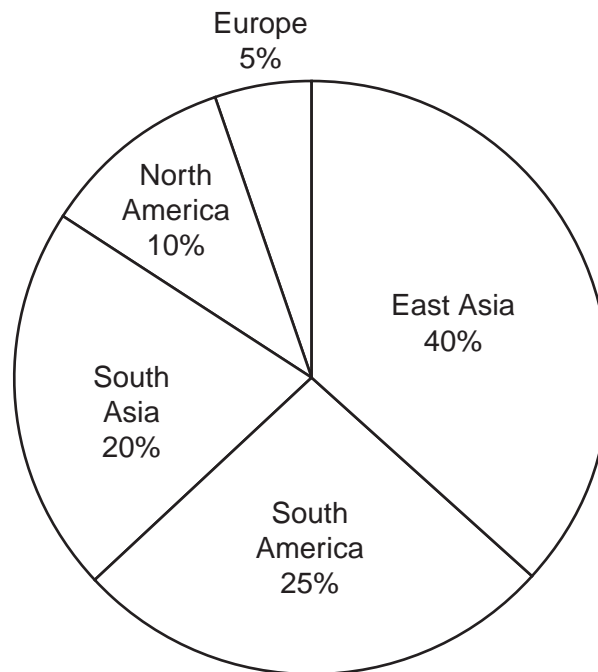


Width of arrow is proportional to number of migrants.
